Just thought of us that day.

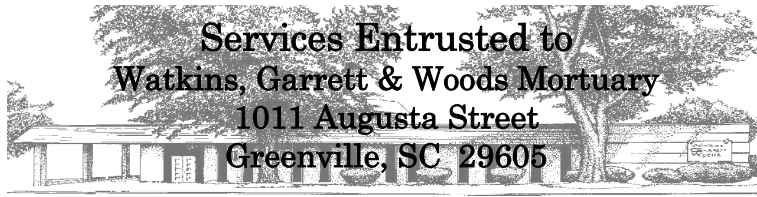
Perhaps you prepared some tasty food

Right here or from afar.

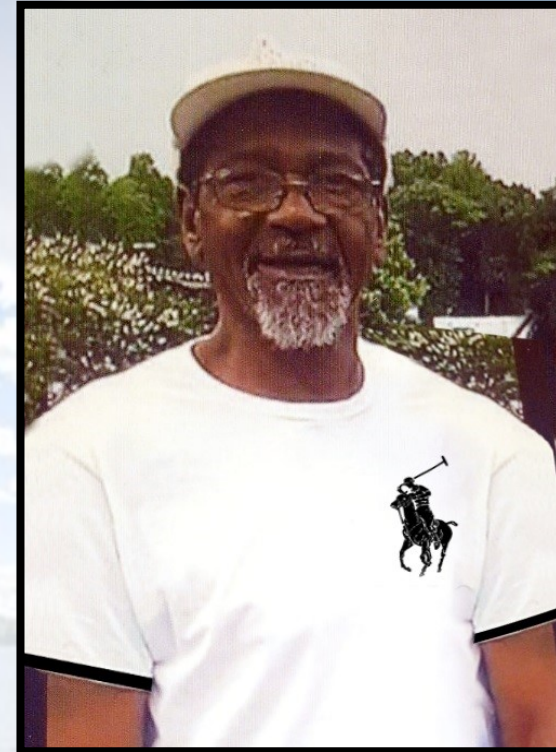
